### LIEUTENANT COLONEL JAMES E. FAGAN

Lieutenant Colonel James E. Fagan is the commander of the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps, Detachment 845 and Professor of Aerospace Studies at Texas Christian University (TCU) in Fort Worth, Texas. He is responsible for recruiting and overseeing the preparation of Department of the Air Force officer candidates through a comprehensive college program for seven participating colleges and universities in and around Forth Worth.

Lt Col Fagan entered the U.S. Air Force in January 2003 through the AFROTC program at the University of Oklahoma. Lt Col Fagan is a career Intelligence officer and has served at a variety of positions at the Squadron, Group, and Numbered Air Force levels. Additionally he served as a Political-Affairs Strategist within the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Political-Military Affairs. In this role he was responsible for managing Department of Defense and Department of State senior leader engagements, executing the Department of State's Foreign Government Employment program, and serving as a military advisor to the State Department's Operation Center and Crisis Task Forces.



Prior to his current position, Lt Col Fagan was the Commander, 451st Intelligence Squadron, Fort Gordon, Georgia. There he led 250 Airmen tasked to conduct and execute Air Force and national intelligence operations supporting four combatant commands.
